On the MGCCSE web

The main news on the internet is that the MGCCSE YouTube channel has been gaining good traction and we are delighted that it has now notched up nearly 6000 views and has nearly 60 subscribers. If we get to 100 subscribers then there are some benefits such as a unique url for the channel so do take a look at the videos and subscribe when you are there. We've been putting up some interviews recorded at MGLive! and Brooklands events made by the Brooklands members.tv team which includes our chairman Tim as lead interviewer! One of those videos the MaGnifcent MaGnettes featuring SE Member John Langford is now heading towards 1,300 views and he is being featured in MG Enthusiast magazine as a result. Good things can come out of it so do take a look.

Of the other social media channels Facebook is still our strongest performer with 375 followers and Instagram chasing it with 320. An interesting observation is the age differentials on each channel which are totally opposite each other – Facebook rises from age 45-54 peaking at 65+ whist Instagram rises from 18-24 peaking at 25-34 before declining. Clearly we have a younger audience on Insta which is mainly photo based and is somewhere we can reach a younger audience to help promote the MGCCSE.

A quick word about the website – Overall we have had nearly 55,000 views of the website with figures for this year steadily well over 1000 a month. That does mean that members are using it regularly to find information about the MGCCSE and we are on course to have record viewing figures for 2022. Predictably the home page gets most views followed by events and natters where people are trying to find out what we are up to. Hopefully they have been finding the answers there too!

Filching Manor 29th May

MGCC SE Centre – Spring Meeting at Filching Manor and Museum 29th May 2022

A Spring Meeting was held this year at Filching Manor and Museum. The event included a Scenic Run, starting just north of Hartfield, along with a Concours d'Elegance and Pride of Ownership competition.

The setting was lovely with the backdrop of the timbered Manor House dated 1450 but in fact built on top of a lot earlier building. The following provides more background to the venue as published on The British Motor Museum's website:

'Filching Manor Motor Museum is part of the Campbell Circuit site. Filching Manor has belonged to the Foulkes Halbard Family for over 35 years and is situated between Wannock and Jevington, near Eastbourne.

The Foulkes Halbard Collection is at Filching Manor Motor Museum. The Foulkes Halbard collection is based around the speed record breaking Campbell family's many achievements. Included in the collection is Sir Malcolm Campbell's Bluebird K3 world record breaking boat, along with other famous Campbell cars, boats and memorabilia.

There are many other rare and wonderful things in the collection, which was originally put together by the late Paul Foulkes Halbard and is now being continued by his son Karl Foulkes Halbard.

The collection contains the very rare 1898 Orient Express (one of only two left working in the world), a 1907 Corbin Racer, several Bugatti cars, Fangio's very own racing car, the Alesso, a fantastic 1904 chain driven Mercedes racing car and many more. Most of the collection is in working order.'

Filching Manor 29th May The event entry attracted close to 50 cars with 24 cars on the scenic run, 3 cars in the concours and 13 cars in the Pride of Ownership. The Concours and Pride of Ownership cars provided an excellent display in front of the Manor House. The scenic run was thoroughly enjoyed by the entrants with the route passing through the Ashdown Forest, through several pretty East Sussex villages and countryside before looping through the South Downs into Filching Manor.

The earliest car was a 1936 MGPB Midget closely followed by a 1939 MGVA Tourer. Other models ranged the full spectrum from the TC through to MGFs and MGZR including a lovely Old English White MG Magnette mkIV. It was also nice to see several Modern Midgets that tend to be in minority of participating cars in recent times.





The event was made more interesting by Karl Foulkes Halbard giving two short talks, one on the Manor House and its history and the other in the main collection museum buildings. The tours started by showing members round Filching Manor – strictly a twin solar Wealden hall – originally built in 1450 for William Parker. Karl thinks that the front door is original, which makes it one of the oldest front doors in private ownership. The main hall is filled with antique furniture and a collection of arms and armour, including several halberds – Karl assumes that his family name means that they must have been halberdiers at some point in the past.

Filching Manor 29th May The Museum talk mainly centred on the K3 Bluebird, covering in principle the history, how it was acquired, what had to be done to restore it until it finally returned to the water in 2012 with appearances at Bewl Water, the Henley Regatta and Lake Maggiore in Switzerland where several of the records were originally set. The boat was originally powered by the RR R series, as used in the Schneider Trophy record breaking aircraft, along with a one off bespoke gearbox and propeller. The drive train was removed and used in the next generation K4 Bluebird.K3 was sold before the war by the Campbell family when the later boats were developed and was used as an attraction for a used car sales showroom before being bought by Thorpe Park. Following acquisition by Filching Manor, the wooden hull was restored (70% of the original hull remains) and mechanical components reinstated. The boat is currently powered by an RR Merlin mated to a suitable gearbox and special fabricated propeller. In recent times, it has achieved speeds up to 59MPH. Karl does have an R series engine but this needs rebuilding after each six hours of use.

Karl is trying to get the boat running again in the Autumn. Possibly at Bewl Water if agreement can be reached with the new owners, and there would be a possibility of the MGCC being invited to attend.

There is also a go-kart circuit in the Manor's grounds which is currently unused. The SE Centre is evaluating whether an Autosolo type of event could be staged there.

One run in was offered, which were also taken up by a number of our members.



In the concours / PoO line up, there included no fewer than two MG NA's brought along by Philip Bayne Powell and his wife, Rosemary. In addition; John Langford brought along his immaculate and rare "Old English white" 1964 MG Magnette MkIV (complete with its unusual "terracotta" interior), which entered the concours alongside a more modern 2005 MG ZR, being shown by the "ZR Concours Guru" - Richard Thorpe. These cars joined Ian Russell and his immaculate 1969 MG Midget, which he had only purchased earlier this year; Robin Taylor's MG ZR; David Brenchleys MGA and Trevor Grouts black MGBV8....all in lovely condition and a credit to their owners.







Amongst other non concours / PoO cars, attending on the day, there were two interesting early MGF's. Andrew & Simon Buck-Honour's 1995, totally original MGF in a rare "Old English white" colour with red interior and which had been owned by them both, since new. The second interesting MGF was Malcolm and Janice LeGrys pre production MGF, in "Anthracite" with its desirable "SVC" number plate, which adorned the very early press cars and MG Rover owned demonstrators.





Trevor Osbourne also added further interest to the day by bringing along his "back-up MG". Trevor's Magnette, in the words of Rolls Royce - (had) "failed to proceed" and brought along his 1940 Ford Tudor saloon with a 5.7 litre engine, no less.

Ron Kemp story by our Treasurer



This article was originally intended for an earlier Newsletter!

Hello there! I'm Ron Kemp, your Treasurer. I accepted the challenge to become Treasurer of the Centre during mid-2021, having previously been the Treasurer of the MGF Register from 2012 to 2018. So after a short break, I'm back and keen to help look after the finances for the SE Centre.

I had my mid-life crisis in 2009 and purchased an 1800cc Honda Goldwing motorcycle. Having done Europe a couple of times and taken part in many pleasant tours with Kent Honda and the 'Appy Wanderers from Yorkshire, it was then time to move back to four wheels. I sold the Goldwing on a Monday in February 2011, and purchased the 2010 MGTF135 the next day! It was a demonstrator from Apple in Gravesend and was just 6 months old with 400 miles on the clock. It has now travelled more than 106,000 miles, including many trips in the UK and Europe, culminating on a long trip to the Greek Islands in 2015! A well-used, well preserved example of this iconic soft top sports car!

Your committee have decided to ensure that all Natters and Wanderers groups have the equipment to better advertise the SE Centre at the events that we attend. To that end we purchased table flags for each group to use at our lunches or evening meals (most of which have been handed out to the leaders), and we are about to commence a roll-out of 5M high sail flags which can be used at outdoor gatherings. As they are quite expensive, the roll-out of the sail flags may take a few years to complete, but will be worth it in the end!

I'm always available to talk with organisers of events that we run, and will give any assistance regarding the financial side of the event. Especially the dreaded VAT! So please contact me and we can talk through your budget for the event, and jointly decide on a reasonable entry fee and discus other expenses.

I've been working with Austin on getting the name of our bank account (currently with Barclays) to match our Centre name, and I am pleased to say that the official account name is now: "The MG Car Club Ltd T/As South East Centre". If you still use cheques (WHY??) you can either write that out in full, or just use "South East Centre". Both are recognised. More and more people are now using bank transfers to pay for entries to events or purchase regalia, so if you are able to do that, the information you need is given on the website or on the entry forms.

Presidential MGF

The Presidential MGF. Tim Morris

I had heard about an amaranth MGF that was being restored by Darre Hardy an MGTF in bits in the midlands and that it had once belonged to the South East Centre's President Derek Edwards and a former chairman Rob Gamage but I didn't know who the current owner was. Imagine my surprise, when attending the South East Centre's Windmill Run in June, a familiar looking amaranth MGF drove along the driveway to Parham House in Sussex—yes, it was none other than N807SVC! At the wheel was South-East member Malcolm Le Grys. This was the car's first outing since being completely renovated over a period of nine months and it hadn't missed a beat. Parking in pride of place amongst the other MGs the amaranth gleamed in the summer sunshine with the house behind. Malcolm later told us the story behind the car.

N807SVC is one of the thirty Rover Group 1995 pre-production press cars, given the Coventry registrations N801SVC to N830SVC. If you find the press cuttings of cars during 1995 invariably it will be one of these cars that you will see pictured.

The car has VIN SARRDWBGBAD000089 with a build date of 25 July 1995, one month before the first production cars rolled off the CAB2 production line. Indeed this car was used as a press demonstrator car and was featured in many publications of that period, both in the lead up to and following the launch of the MGF. These included a full road test in MG World magazine and a feature in Classic & Sports Car Weekly, both of which are held in the car's history file.



After the initial flurry of press reports and test drives Rover Group kept the press cars for three years. They were not intended as production models but after that time they finally agreed, in 1998, to sell them on to Company and Car Club executives, intending them mainly for track use.

Rover were not keen on these cars appearing in the market-place as they were "not necessarily to Production Standard", and all purchasers were required to sign a document stating that no warranty was given or implied, and that they would not attempt to pursue any claims with Rover Group whatever the cause!

They were sold and many were used on the track as specified but others were registered for the road, this was one of those. Rob Gammage, then the Chief Executive of the MG Car Club, purchased N807SVC from Rover for just £5000 in May 1998 and used the car personally. Rob was also a previous chairman of the South East Centre and has known Derek Edwards for many years so, eleven years later, ownership of the F was passed to Derek, who is the current President of the MG Car Club South East. However, the car was not used much and was put to the back of the garage and only appeared occasionally.

So, he put the car up for sale at the start of the pandemic in 2020 and Malcolm and Janice attempted to buy the car at that point, but they were pipped at the post by another MG enthusiast purchaser. Luckily though, Derek agreed to give their contact details to the new purchaser should he decide to sell at any time.





The car was subject to some recommissioning and light restoration at that time but then he decided to move the car on. 
